The Museum of Everything presents Nek Chand & The Kingdom of Gods and Goddesses

Dear high-brow/low-brow Time Out browser, your search for enlightenment is over! Those handsome champions of everyday creativity - The Museum of Everything - have returned to London, and they've brought with them one of the most inspired human beings ever to channel the spirit of the divine and make what we call art. That earthbound icon is Nek Chand, the nearly 90 year old creator of the Rock Garden in Chandigarh, India, an architectural dreamscape, where three thousand sculptures welcome over ten thousand visitors, dawn to dusk, every damn day. It's a wonder of our unmodern world, a monument to patience and persistence. But don't take for granted our cer tainty of this gentleman's brilliance ... you surely need to witness it for yourself. We cannot recommend strongly enough that you hop, skip, sprint and thrust your way over to The Museum of Every-thing at Hayward Gallery, and discover for yourself one hundred sculptures from Nek Chand's original environment, without the hassle of having to backpack all the way there.

As if that wasn't enough, the show is open every day and forms part of the Alternative Guide to the Universe, a supremely otherwordly immersion into the thoughts, behaviours, systems and realisations of mankind, featuring over twenty of the untrained, unintentional, undiscovered and unclassifiable artists celebrated by The Museum of Everything.
